Prepositions are words that describe relationships between nouns or pronouns and other words in a sentence.

Example:

A mouse squeezed **through** the tiny hole.

The word *through* is a preposition. Without it, the reader would not know what *the tiny hole* had to do with the mouse. *The tiny hole* is the **prepositional object**, and *through the tiny hole* makes up the **prepositional phrase**.

Prepositions can describe location (*over, in*), time (*before, after*), direction (*toward, from*), purpose (*for*), or other relationships.
